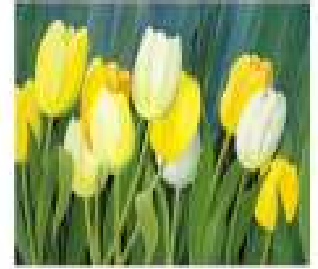

With the passing of Mayor Metzger, Council is accepting letters of intent to fill the position.

CodeRED, (ENC) is a high speed notification system which can quickly deliver messages to the entire Borough or targeted areas as necessary. Amber Alerts, road closures and extreme weather alerts are examples. Messages are delivered via phone, cell phone, email and text. It is important to stress CodeRED provides a data base supplied from county records, however, that information may not be accurate and will not include your cell phone and email addresses. The system is only as good as the information it has so we urge you to read the information provided in

this mailing and update your preferred method (s) of notification. Go to the Borough website, stockertown.org, and click on the CodeRED link, or complete the enclosed form and return it to the Boro Office. If you have questions or need assistance please call the Borough office. ANY/ALL information will be secure and used only by CodeRED for the purpose of notification and WILL NOT be sold, exchanged, or made available to anyone for marketing by ENC or the Boro. Please respond with your current information preferences so the system can notify/protect you.

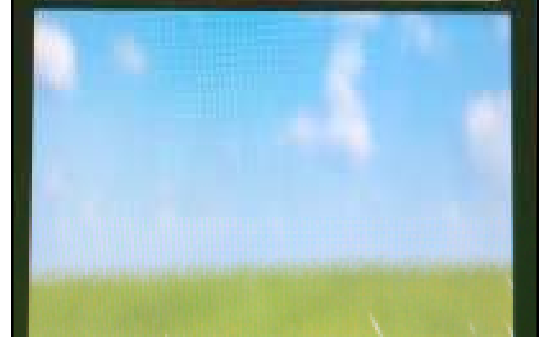
Coming in May

FOOTNOTES FROM THE BOROUGH

~ Please have identification tags on your pets, (cats and dogs), and make every effort to protect and contain them.

~ By ordinance, all pets must be on a leash when on Borough or Public property. If your dog should defecate on public property you are responsible to clean it up immediately and dispose of it in a trash receptacle.

~ For residents wanting library access, Easton Public Library and Mary Meuser Library will provide library cards to the residents of Stockertown. The Borough will reimburse residents when a receipt is provided to the Secretary.

~ Nazareth Ambulance Corp is our Emergency Service provider. Forks Fire is our Fire Protection service. Stockertown is included in their yearly membership requests. Your donation helps fund training, operational costs and purchase equipment which helps protect you.

~ It is unlawful to discharge ground water, pool or sump pump water into the Borough's sewer system. Anyone found in violation will be prosecuted.

~ The recycling center is for Stockertown residents only! Please flatten cardboard, tie paper bundles and deposit all recyclables in the containers provided on Lafevre Road.

~ We no longer accept branches to chip. Please bundle and tie all branches and put with weekly trash pick-up.

~ It is unlawful to throw grass, branches, pine needles or other debris ANYWHERE over on or around the bank of the creek. We provide full service trash collection for the disposal of yard waste

~ Stockertown has a Fire and Burn Ordinance. It eliminates all open burning within the Borough limits except for recreational fires. "Recreational fire" means any fire ignited in the confines of a fire ring, chimenea, fireplace, or patio burning device and used only for recreational pleasure. All recreational fires must include a metal covering device or spark arrestor with spaces of not more than one-half (1/2") inch, over the entire surface of the containerized fire. Prohibited fires include burning of any refuse, construction waste, hazardous material, or trees, brush, stumps, leaves, and grass clippings.

~ It is so important that residents don't put improper materials into the sewer system. Nothing but toilet waste, kitchen and bath water should ever enter your sewer line! NOT grease, diapers, feminine products, dead animals, or cloth items. The Waste Water Treatment Plant is not a landfill, but a delicate balance of biological processes.

April 22 is Earth Day

Take nothing but pictures, leave nothing but footprints, kill nothing but time.

A note to parents ~

There are multiple bodies of water within the Borough including retention ponds, fishing ponds, and creeks. Please reinforce the dangers of still or running water with your kids.
