2023 IN REVIEW

General Administrative News

- Stockertown's General and Sewer Fund Budgets for 2024 totaling \$958,927 are displayed on the next page. The anticipated income and expenditures reflect our continuing effort to provide quality services to our residents. The tax rate has been fixed at 18 mils again for 2024. Despite the increases in insurances, utilities and wages, there were no enormous legal fees like those incurred in 2022-2023 from the Police Department issues.
- The sewer usage rate for 2024 will remain at \$50 per month per EDU. Tapping Fees are set at \$4,006 per EDU for each new connection.
- The annual fee for Fire Protection provided by Forks Township, remains at \$15,000, (since 2006). Other line items in the Fire Protection budget include a shared percentage of utilities, fire hydrant fees, and a Fire Fund contribution.
- Fry's Four Seasons lawn care agreement has been renewed for 2024.
- The Borough has hired Suzanne Borzak of KeyCodes to provide zoning and inspection services. She is in house once a week to address prior and current zoning violations, permits, and general information. She is a welcome asset.

Police Department Update

- While efforts continue to restructure the Police Department, the scarcity of experienced and reputable law enforcement candidates remains a problem.
 Be assured that every effort is focused on creating a creditable Police Department that the residents expect and deserve.
- During this interim period, the PA State Police will continue to provide coverage. They have assured us that they have their eye on our community, which is evident by their increased visibility and prompt responses to vehicular and domestic issues. Most recently, a potentially dangerous situation occurred within the Borough that was swiftly handled by PSP, its patrol unit, and their special emergency response team, (SERT) and was resolved within a short time. This incident provided an example of the coordinated efforts of PSP, Forks Fire, Emergency Management and Public Works to secure the area so PSP could engage and safely resolve the situation,

Public Works Department

- The PW Department provided snow removal, road and trail maintenance, leaf and branch pickup among their many jobs. This past fall, the borough contracted to have dead trees topped along the Rails to Trails to avoid potential injury from falling limbs. PW will continue branch removal as time permits.
- PW continually monitors portions of the sewer lines that are suspect to backup issues. The Borough will always be responsible for the maintenance, repair, and replacement of the sewer lines within the Borough, but we need your help to prevent unnecessary blockages. Pease remember, like our former WWTP (waste water treatment plant), Easton's Sewer System does not permit the disposal of flushable wipes, feminine products, grease, etc. The sewer system is NOT a garbage disposal. Blockages can also occur in our lines





FOOTNOTES FROM THE BOROUGH

- During heavy rain and flooding events please do not route your sump pump or other flood waters to your sewer connection. It is unlawful and punishable by law to route stormwater of any type into the sewer system.
- During a SNOW EMERGENCY all vehicles must be removed from the streets. The snow emergency will be announced on WFMZ, B104, and 69 NEWS. Vehicles left on streets will be towed. The parking lots on State Street, and the Center Street Trail head will be plowed for off street parking during snow events to enable plows to clean the whole street and avoid possible damage to vehicles.
- You have 24 hours to clear your sidewalks after a snowfall. If you live near a hydrant, please take a few extra minutes and shovel around it.
- It is unlawful to push or shovel snow from your property onto a public street in the Borough. Violators will be cited.
- For those who would like library access, Easton Public Library and Mary Meuser Library will provide library cards to the residents of Stockertown. The Borough will reimburse residents when a receipt is provided to the Secretary.
- Please have identification tags on your pets, (cats and dogs), and make every effort to contain and protect them from traffic and harsh weather.
- Bulk Pickup: Anyone with large items to be disposed of may put out 1 large item per week on Wednesdays. No TVs, refrigerators or tires.

with the potential of causing raw sewage overflow or residential backup.

The Borough was awarded several grants during 2023. They include \$150,000 toward Lincoln Street reconstruction, \$72,210 for a 2022 Ford 550 crew cab truck with snow plow and salt spreader, and \$69,497 for a 2023 track loader with snow thrower attachment. In addition, our PW men won a \$5,500+ line striper while attending a Seal Master seminar. A replacement zero turn mower was also purchased for use on the Trail, We are awaiting a decision, expected this spring, on a second grant application needed to complete the Lincoln Street project.

Planning Commission

 Planning members continue to review the Borough's current zoning regulations comparing them to the comprehensive plan.
