#### **Grants Good News!!**

The Borough was just awarded a grant to purchase a Ford F-550 dump truck with salt spreader and plow. Currently there are none available for purchase until 2023. We are awaiting a decision on a second grant to purchase a skid steer with snowblower attachment, replacing the current 10 year old unit.

We are applying for a Multimodal Transportation Fund grant in the amount of \$256,929, with a 30% match, which if awarded will be used to widen and repave Lincoln Street. The match amount will come from our Liquid fuels account.
