AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STOCKERTOWN ESTABLISHING FAITH AVENUE AT THE INTERSECTION OF JUBILEE DRIVE AS A STOP INTERSECTION IN BOTH DIRECTIONS OF TRAVEL.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough of Stockertown, Northampton County, Pennsylvania, and it is enacted and ordained by the authority of same, pursuant to the Borough Code, as amended, and Vehicle Code, as amended, as follows:

SECTION 1:

Chapter 228 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

ARTICLE V Stop Intersections

§ 228-16. Stop Intersections Designated

The following intersections are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs are hereby confirmed as officially erected at the following locations controlling traffic on the first named road, erected on the first named road at its intersection with the second named road, in the direction or directions hereby indicated. All vehicles and tractors approaching any such intersection upon the first named highway in the direction or directions hereby indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance before entering any such intersection:

Stop Sign On

Direction of Travel

At Intersection Of

Faith Avenue

Both

Jubilee Drive

SECTION 2:

All Ordinances or portions thereof which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby specifically repealed.

SECTION 3:

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or portion or part of this Ordinance shall be declared to be invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of Record or of competent jurisdiction then, in that event, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain unaffected and remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4:

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately.
